

**South Central Section  
Spring Aviation Scholarship Advisor Report  
April 2005**

The deadline has passed for submission of Amelia Earhart Memorial Scholarship applications and applications for Future Woman Pilot Awards for 2005. This year there was also a Maule Tailwheel training award. The SCS AE Scholarship Committee reviewed the applications for each category as we do each year. During that review we work with applicants to correct minor problems, etc., before forwarding the applications to the Trustees on February 15. The Trustees met in March to select career scholarship finalists and FWP winners. They also chose a winner for the Maule Tailwheel Award. The FWP winners were sent a check for \$1000 and the finalists' applications were sent to the final judges for review. AE scholarship winners are usually notified by the end of April or early May.

This year we received eight applications for AE Scholarships, five FWP applications, and one Maule Tailwheel Training application. The Chapters submitting applications and the applicants themselves did an especially good job of completing the application forms. All the signatures were dated on or before January 5, 2005, and many of the applications came to me well ahead of the January 15 deadline for postmark.
